1. Welcome and introductions

a. New members (Ron, Angie, Jill, Yvette, Jalen) introduced themselves

2. Amherst's Test-Optional Pilot Program

- a. Matt gave a short presentation on our current standardized test-optional policy
 - i. There are other small liberal arts colleges that are also test-optional
 - ii. Some Southern public universities, as well as Georgetown and MIT, have continued to require testing for the admission process
 - iii. There are also test-free schools: all UC campuses are test-free, meaning that whether or not an applicant submits scores, the scores will not be considered
 - iv. Overview of some of the original policies at Amherst, as well as Amherst's choices toward the end of the 20th century regarding testing
 - v. Discussed why students might choose to submit test scores in a test-optional environment and whether there could be any kind of predictor of GPA performance in college based on past standardized test scores
- b. As the pilot program completes its second full year in the admission cycle, Amherst must make a decision about what we will do about standardized testing by the end of calendar 2023, but ideally could make the decision this semester
 - i. Current high school sophomores have this very much on their minds
- c. Discussed whose perspectives across campus would be valuable to engage in considering whether Amherst will move forward in a test-optional format or not
