## 2. Updates from the Admission and Financial Aid World

- a. Matt shared an overview of the changes made by the Supreme Court case on race-neutral admissions, as well as the changes made to the FAFSA this year
  - Other Amherst specific changes include updating our website and major redesigns happening, and an update to the cost of attendance model at Amherst that will include textbooks (starting 2024-2025 academic year), as opposed to seeing that cost as a supplemental part of attending Amherst
- b. Gail shared her perspective on the changes being made to the FAFSA this year, and explained some work going on in the background to make the communication about what the changes will mean for students and families clear and straightforward
- c. Students shared about a new project in Education Studies called "Pipelines," that gives Amherst students the opportunity to work with and conduct research within the larger community around Amherst, partnering with organizations and schools near Amherst
