DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

Scope and Content Note

The Grigorii Poliak Papers consist of personal correspondence with prominent figures in the émigré community, professional correspondence related to the activities of the Silver Age Publishing House, bookkeeping records, sound recordings of interviews and telephone conversations, photographs, and an extensive collection of newspaper clippings. The vast majority of the material is written in Russian.

As of May 2013, only the first series of the Grigorii Poliak Papers (Correspondence) has been cataloged and listed. Researchers interested in materials from subsequent series should contact the Director for more information.

Series Descriptions

Series 1: CORRESPONDENCE (1970s-1990s) contains personal correspondence between Poliak and prominent émigrés, supplemented correspondence accompanied by related typescripts and clippings (sorted by subject), and professional correspondence specifically related to the business of the Silver Age Publishing House.

Sub-series 1: Personal Correspondence

Series 2: PROFESSIONAL MATERIALS contains professional and business materials relating to Poliak's publishing endeavors, including the Silver Age Publishing house and "Chast' rechi," a literary almanac released by Silver Age Publishing.

Sub-series 2: Silver Age Publishing (Serebryanyi vek)

Series 3: RESEARCH MATERIALS contains clippings for dozens of Russian émigré writers and typescripts of works by Yu. Trifonov ("Vremya i mesto"), V. Grossman ("Stalingrad"), L. Losev ("Perevody," "P'amyati vodki," "Bor'ba s udushiem"), which Poliak was likely using for his own writing.

Series 4: PRINTED JOURNALS AND NEWSPAPERS contains clippings collected by Poliak for a planned comprehensive archive of Russian émigré writers.

Series 6: CASSETTES/RECORDINGS contains telephone conversations between Poliak and various figures of the Russian emigration from the 1980s on. Some of these recordings have been transferred on to CD.

Series 7: THIRD PARTY MATERIALS includes materials of Rudolf (Vladimir Ivanovich) Yurasov (1914-1996), Helena Dobrschansky, a 1943 address of A.A. Vlasov in Riga, and unidentified materials from 1930s.
