



# Psychology Major Requirements



## 9 Classes Total

- 3 foundational classes
- 3 distribution classes in three different areas
- 2 seminars in two different areas
- 1 additional class (i.e., an elective, an extra distribution or seminar, or honors work)

## Foundational courses

- Psych 100 - Introduction (*by end of sophomore year*)
- Psych 122 – Statistics (*or another college statistics class; by end of sophomore year*)
- *A research methods or lab class:* Psych 200 – Research Methods, Psych 204 – Emotion, Psych 205 – Sex Differences, Psych 206 – Psychology of Play, Psych 208 – Creativity (*by end of junior year*)
